

MRS. ROOSEVELT CALM AT BLAZE

Ex-President's Widow Sips from a Cup as Firemen Work in Son's Coffee House—Prize Paintings in Peril.

New York, April 10.—Mrs. Theodore Roosevelt Sr., widow of Colonel Roosevelt, was among the patrons of the Double R Coffee House, operated by her son and relatives, one day last week, when firemen, with hose, chemical extinguishers, axes and hooks, rushed to fight a fire in the kitchen.

Mrs. Roosevelt showed no alarm when the fire started in the rear of the coffee house and smoke filled the establishment. The widow of the former President calmly sipped her coffee while Frank Sarda, manager, doffed his coat, ran back into the kitchen and directed the bucket brigade. Sarda and his men kept the fire under control until the fire apparatus arrived in response to an alarm turned in by a policeman. As the smoke began to fill the coffee house Sarda and his employees hurriedly draped two large oil paintings of Colonel Roosevelt hanging on opposite walls in the front of the establishment. The oil paintings are part of a large collection representing the work of individuals and members of the Art Students' League and the Society of Illustrators. One of the prize paintings which was threatened by the fire because of its proximity to the kitchen was a painting of Erna Rubinstein, youthful violinist, done in oils by N. Honti, 66 West Thirty-eight street. Another work is that of Italian needlewomen who executed in silk embroidery a picture of Colonel Roosevelt, passing the Public Library in an open victoria on his return from his famous African hunting trip.

The fire started in a coffee roaster and caused about \$100 damage. It was the second fire within two months in the kitchen. Mrs. Roosevelt was kept informed of the progress of the fire fighting by Sarda, and when the blaze was extinguished, she left the place, re-entered her automobile and drove away.

The "Double R" in the coffee house's name stands for Roosevelt and Robinson.

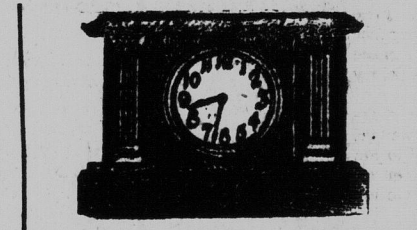

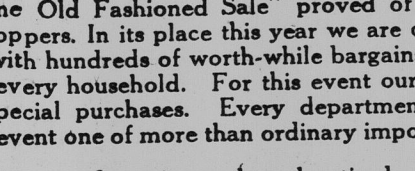
