ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, TORONTO.

Two and a half miles west of the City hall, on Queen st. The property is vested in the Crown. Government appoints medical super-intendent, bursar, and inspector. The latter frames by-laws for its government, and thoroughly examines the asylum, and reports to the Lieutenant-Governor. The admission of patients is regulated by cap. 31, 36 Victoria statutes of Ontario, which requires that the patient be examined separately and apart by three licensed medical practitioners who certify to the insanity. Application for admission must be made before sending lunatics. Idiots and persons afflicted with paralysis are inadmissible. Daniel Clark, M.D., medical super-
