ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, TORONTO.

Two and a half miles west of the City hall, on Queen st. The property is vested in the Crown. Government appoints medical superintendent, bursar, and inspector. The latter frames by-laws for its government, and thoroughly examines the asylum, and reports to the Lieutenant-Governor. The admission of patients is regulated by cap. 31, 36 Victoria statutes of Ontario, which requires that the patient be examined separately and apart by three licensed medical practitioners who certify to the insanity. Application for admission must be made before sending lunatics. Idiots and persons afflicted with paralysis are inadmissible. Daniel Clark, M.D., medical super-

Whenever it is practicable, the institution desires to retain the services of nursing mothers for a limited time. Mothers in service and widows who place their children here are required to pay five dollars a month. It is designed only to keep the children until two or three years of age, when it is hoped
