The cashmere, veiling or crepe de chine, of which the gown may be made is gathered at shoulder and waistline in the bretelles and at the top of the skirt. The guimpe may be very dainty and exquisite as to material or be of some soft silk or lingerie fabric. The sleeves of this may be in single or double puff and in full length or shorter. The bretelles are tacked to the guimpe so that there is no possibility of their sliding around. The skirt is a most graceful one in five gores intended for Empire waist line or regulation style, as shown.
