Senator Robertson To Investigate

THE COST OF NECESSITIES OTTAWA, May 16.-That there Canadian prices are regula ed by demand abroad, that there is no great surplus of food supply in Canada, that the duty of Canada is food production for the benefit of itself and the world, that the Government may present a programme to regulate the cost of living, and that industrial un-rest can be traced to the cost of living, were stated to the Senate to-day by the Hon. Mr. Robertson, Minister of Labor.

Mr. Robertson said the people of Canada should know that there is no surplus of food in Canada, and unless production is increased there was little hope for such reduction of

If all the butter in storage on May 1st were divided, it would give each Canadian 1.7 ounces; a division of oleomargarine would give each Canadian a quarter of an ounce; a division of the cheese would give each person less than a quarter of a pound. famine within a year.
