An Act to provide for the separation of the County of Durham from the County of Northumberland,

WHEREAS a great number of the inhabitants of the United Coun- Preamble. ties of Northumberland and Durham have by their petitions represented, that from the increasing wealth and population of the said county of Durham, and in order to accommodate the inhabitants thereof, 5 it is desirable that the same should be detached and set apart from the county of Northumberland for judicial and other purposes, and that the county town for the said county should be established by the Legislature. and have prayed that an Act may be passed for the above purpose; And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition and ac-10 cordingly to provide for the separation of the said county of Durham from the said county of Northumberland as soon as the necessary provisions for that purpose shall have been made; Therefore Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows :
