

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with several amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the collection of certain Tolls therein mentioned," was read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read for the third reading of the Bill intituled: "An Act to revive and amend the Acts relating to the Saint Gabriel Lavee and Railway Company."

On motion of the Honorable Mr. McMillan, seconded by the Honorable Mr. McInnes (New Westminster), it was

Ordered, That the same be postponed until Tuesday next.

The Order of the Day being read for the third reading of the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Act to incorporate the Prescott County Railway Company, and to change the name of the Company to 'The Central Counties Railway Company,'"

The Honorable Mr. Clemow moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Flint,

That the said Bill be not now read a third time, but that it be referred back to the Select Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbors for further consideration.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and

Ordered, accordingly.

The Order of the Day being read for the consideration of the Eighth Report of the Select Committee on Divorce, to whom was referred the Bill intituled: "An Act for the relief of Arthur Wand," together with the evidence taken before the said Committee.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Clemow, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Flint, it was

Ordered, That the same be postponed until Tuesday next.

The House adjourned during pleasure.

After some time the House was resumed.

The Honorable Samuel Henry Strong, one of the Puisné Judges of the Supreme Court of Canada, Deputy Governor, being seated on the Throne,

The Honorable the Speaker commanded the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod to proceed to the House of Commons and acquaint that House: "It is the Deputy Governor's desire that they attend him immediately in this House."

Who being come with their Speaker,

The Clerk of the Crown in Chancery read the titles of the Bills to be passed severally as follows:—

An Act to make further provision respecting Inquiries concerning Public Matters.

An Act respecting Corrupt Practices in Municipal Affairs.

An Act to permit the Conditional Release of First Offenders in certain cases.
