And the Honorable Charles Boucher de Boucherville, of Boucherville, for the Electoral Division of Montarville, in the room of the Honorable Louis Lacoste, deceased.

The Honorable the Speaker informed the House that there was a Member without ready to be introduced, when the Honorable William Henry Brouse was introduced between the Honorable Messieurs Christie and Páquet.

The Honorable Mr. Brouse presented Her Majesty's Writ summoning him to the Senate.

The same was then read by the Clerk,

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed : WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honorable Sir FREDERICK TEMPLE, Earl of Dufferin, Viscount and Baron Clandeboye of Clandeboye, in the County of Down, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baron Dufferin and Clandeboye, of Ballyleidy and Killeleagh, in the County of Down, in the Peerage of Ireland, and a Baronet, Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, and Knight Commander of Our Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor General of Canada, and Vice-Admiral of the same. At Our Government House, in Our City of Ctawa, in Our Dominion of Canada, this Ninth day ot August, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-eight, and in the Forty-second Year of Our Reign.
