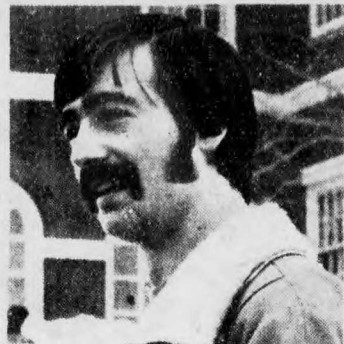

..No, I didn't. I am not interested in it.



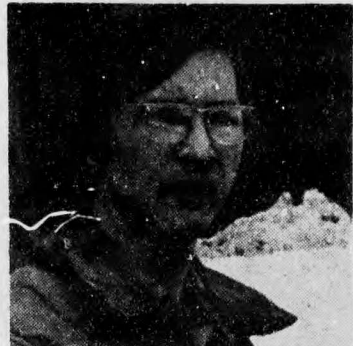
Marilyn Barnes Bus. Admin. 3

Mr. Dress-Up delights kids

Mr. Dress-Up was on campus Tuesday afternoon to give a much-appreciated performance before a delighted crowd of squirming, squealing, laughing youngsters.

The scene was reminiscent of early Beatles' concerts as the children in the crowded SUB ballroom greeted each new act with screams of pleasure. Mr. Dress-Up had no problems encouraging his audience to participate and sing along.
