A bye-election wont matter to Martin. Another possibility is G. D. Johnson of Melfort. Is a big farmer. His family lives at victoria, B.C. all winter. He lives in Sask. in summer. - raises 25 to 30 thousand bushels of wheat annuably. Is also a local M.P.P. Wm. Bashford of Rosthern, M.P.P. may try to get the Federal Convention. He can't get the Prov. Convention again owing to feeling raised among German settlers over some flag incident.

Sorth Battleford. - March 13th, 1921. Hon. C. McNab - McNab, A. D. Pickel might run here and be in the same position as McDonald in Prince Albert. E.S. Clinch of Shellbrook, M.P.P., can win here. He is not well off. Jas. Miller, a farmer and contractor for C.N.R., is good man. (Locke says so too) But failure of C.N.R. to construct certain branches has made farmers sore on Miller whom they blame. He was to be our candidate before 1917 but was forced out in Calder's deal in that election.

Humboldt - March 13th, 1921 - Hon. C. McNab and D.C.McNab - Fred Totske formerly of Kitchener, Ont., a druggist in Vonda, 32 years old, is best man. Fairly well off. Stewart who lives in N.E. Part of the Riding, N. of Watson, not well off, quite an orator, wants to run - Went to Convention in 1917 against Lang, M.P., and was beaten only by 1 or 2 votes. Fraser of Allan and proprietor of the Tribune Newspaper will also want the Convention. is a good rustler.

Saltcoats - March 12th, 1921 - C. J. Locke, -W.R. Motherwell could run here but is being persuaded that it would be better if he got behind some other one. Dr. Sahlmark M.P.P. is the man here.

March 13, 1921. Hon. C. and D.C.McNab - Motherwell is first choice. In the Provide lection he is going out after the non-partisan league and in favor of local M.P.P.'s Knows more about the situation than anyone else. Will gain a good deal of prestige in the local election work. He would undoubtedly get the Federal Convention before anyoneelse if he wants it.

Dr. Sahlmark and J. R. Gardiner both M.P.B. have about equal chances. Gardiner has no money. Sahlmark has, The latter is brother-in-law of Hon. J.R. Boyle of Edmonton.

Rev. Dr. Bayne formerly a Pres. Minister at Pembroke out now living in Melville Sask might be wanted by some people. He is a great talker, has no regular church, goesout around preaching and lecturing.

McKenzie March 13th, 1921 - Hon. C. and D.C.McNab - Tom Garry a farmer and Liberal Whip in Provincial House representing Yorkton is the man. D. C. McNab thinks we couldn't carry this seat for the Province if Garry goes to the Federal. Hon. C.
