Amabel, Sales 7128 & 7187, I have to inform you that the understanding of the Department in the matter is as stated in letter to you of the I5th Ultimo, véz:- that upon receipt of \$100.00 (not \$50.6I, as stated by you) from Mr. Knoch B. Hunter, the question of cancelling both of the present Sales, and the entry of a new Sale in Mr. Hunter's name for the whole Lot, would be considered, with a view to issuing Patent to him for the whole Lot. This proposal, of course, is upon condition of Mr. Hunter filing the usual proof as to occupation and settlement of the Lot.
