its confidence or lack of confidence in the administration,

hon. members are well aware that it is possible at any time
for any hon. member to move a vote of want of confidence on
a motion to go into Committee of Supply. Were it thought

Advisable to proceed by that method to ascertain the opinion
of the House, if, at the time, there were no estimates before
the Housek, the government might bring a special supplementary
estimate, and immediately move to have the House go into
Committee of Supply. Any hon. member who wished to do so,

There is another, and a more direct method of procedure. That was the method followed in the Parliament at Westminster in January last, after Mr. Churchill's return from his earlier visit to the United States and Canada. On January 27th, Mr. Churchill expressed to the House of Commons his desire to be sustained by a vote of confidence.

The following day, Mr. Attlee moved:

"That the proceedings on the motion relating to confidence in His Majesty's Government be exempted, at this day's sitting from the provisions of the Standing Order (Sittings of the House)".
