Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 12th instant, with reference to the Commission being furnished with a copy of the regulations promulgated with respect to special privileges to be granted to Indians in the killing of deer and certain varieties of duck, for food requirements, during the close season.

In reply, I beg to enclose herewith copy of circular letter, dated April 28th, addressed to various Indian Agents with regard to the question of permits to Indians in organized districts; this question, as also that of Indians killing deer for food in unorganized districts, is covered by section 9 of the "Game Act", copy of which I am to-day sending under separate cover.
