MARKET REVIEW AND FORECAST

Toronto, Monday, Oct. 26.—The volume of trade is considerably below that reported at the same date last year. There is a growing impression, however, that the war is not altogether responsible. That orders would have fallen off in any case.

WHEAT Statistics announced by the War Department of Agriculture indicate that the wheat crops of all nations in 1914 aggregate 374,118,000 bushels against 4,125,710,000 bushels in 1913.
