"The great fleet which carried the First Canadian Division across to England at the outbreak of war assembled in Gaspé Basin, on the cost of Quebec. On October 3rd, 1914, the transports steamed out of Gaspé Bay in three lines ahead, led by His Majesty's ships Charybdis, Diana and Eclipse, with the Glory and Suffolk on the flanks, and the Talbot in the rear. Later, the Suffolk's place was taken by the battle-cruiser Queen Mary. The voyage was made without mishap, the fleet entering Plymouth Sound on the evening of October 14th."—Canada in Flanders, Vol. 1.
