WORKS AT SILICA

An Industry of the Greatest Importance to Rossland.

A FINE REDUCTION PLANT

A Description of the Reduction Works of the British Columbia Bullion Extraction Co. It Can Successfully Treat Low Grade Ores.

At Silica, three miles southwest of this city, on the Red Mountain railway, are the works of the British Columbia Bullion Extraction Company.

Let us now follow the ore in its downward course of treatment: From the main line, after the cars are backed in on the company's siding, each car is weighed as it passes over the 60-ton track scales.

The ore from the receiving ore bins is fed by gravity into a 9x15 inch Blake rock crusher, which breaks the rock with its powerful jaws to about one-quarter inch.

From the sampling ore falls through the chute into a three-compartment ore bin which has a capacity of 400 tons and is used to store various lots of ore preparatory to treatment.

From the pulverizing mills the ore passes through the various processes for cyanide treatment, receiving agitators, percolation and washes in the usual form.
