MAY BREAK AGREEMENT

Old Deal Between Railroads is Shaky

U. P. May Invade Puget Sound Country and N. P. Go Into California.

Seattle, April 9.—Rumors are rife in railroad circles that an understanding has about been reached between the Great Northern and Union Pacific lines whereby the old agreement not to invade each others territory will be set aside. The Union Pacific is to find an entrance into the Puget Sound country and the Northern Pacific is to build a line from Portland south through Oregon to San Francisco with terminals at California coast points.
