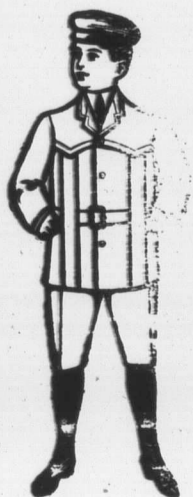

VILLAGE COUNCIL

Minutes of May meeting of the Athens village council, held on the 2nd, 4th and 7th inst. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. The following motions were passed:

Arnold—Jacob—That the resignation of the Athens High School Board dated April 24, to raise money for permanent improvements to high school building be received and laid over for consideration at a special meeting to be called by the Reeve.

Arnold—Gordon—That Constable Booth's bill for miscellaneous articles and disbursements, \$8.19, be received and paid.

Arnold—Gordon—That Councillor Jacob be authorized to send a garbage depository from W. T. Hayes for the 12 months following the date of this resolution for the sum of \$5.00.

Gordon—Jacob—That the assessment roll presented by the assessor be accepted.

Arnold—Jacob—That permission be and is hereby given to the Post Office Department of Canada to erect at the corner of Main and Elgin streets a post office building in accordance with Plan No. 4129 and specifications to this council submitted.

Jacob—Gordon—That the contractor for the new post office building be granted permission to place building material on the streets adjacent to the work, subject to the approval of the Road Commissioners, and that the contractor be responsible for any damage resulting therefrom.

Arnold—Gordon—That the clerk be instructed to prepare a By-law for the appointment of a village engineer.

Jacob—Gordon—That the resignation of F. F. Booth of the position of Village Officer, dated May 3, 1912, be accepted.

Arnold—Jacob—That the council meet as a Court of Revision on May 28, at 6 o'clock.

The Collapsible Lifeboat

The collapsible lifeboat which figures prominently in the discussions of the Titanic wreck is a boat with canvas sides and a framework which shuts together like a folding gate. When opened out the boat is nearly square. It is provided with cylinders like a steamboat so that it is practically unsinkable. On the water it serves more the purpose of a raft than boat, but it will hold 50 to 60 persons and can be rowed slowly.
