## Life Lost In **Moncton Fire**

Moncton, N. B. Dec 25-One ma lost his life, property to the amount of between forty and fifty thousand dollars was destroyed, and the Moncton street Railway was temporarily put out of commission by a fire which burned down the Moncton Tramway Electric and Gas Company's barn and machine shop, between 3 and 4 o'clock this morning, Grant Toole, about forty years of age, in some unaccount able manner during the progress of the fire, received injuries from which he died about ten hours later in the City Hospital. Toole, the watchman in the car barns, belongs to Calhouns N. B., where he had a wife and three

children living. In addition to the car barn, macdestroyed. Three other cars were




