"Prices are coming down in all most all commodities," said Robert Dollar, president of the Robert Dollar Steamship Company of the Pacho Coast. This statement was made from his knowledge of the cartying trade of the oceans of the world.



"At the present time," he said, "ships can be obtained twice as cheap on the Clyde as they can be built in the United States or in Cahoda. I am not as familiar with Canadian prices as I am with the United States ones, but there is no quertion as to facts. Cargo boatcar be bought on the Clyde and brought over here with a great saving over having them built here.

Tordinary cargo boats today are selling on the Clyde at twenty pounds or one hundred dollars a ton. When the money is sent from the United States and the difference in the money of the two countries is taken into occount because of the exchangistration this means just about 370 peg ton in United States money. The same ships in the United States cost 4160 a ton to build. I expect the Canadian prices are not far off this figure."
