What We Get For the Money ! On January 1st this year our total investment in tele

phone property-buildings, equipment, tools and sup. plies, plus what it has cost in actual cash to put this working equipment into service-was \$51,458,306. On fhe same date we had in operation 337,476 telephone instruments.

This means an investment of \$152 for each telephone instrument in service.

What has been provided for this investment of \$152 per telephone?
