

A most picturesque addition the furnishing of the sanctuary the Paschal Candle stands in i massive candlestick on the Gosp side from Holy Saturday until Ascension Thursday, writes Mgr Henry for the N.C.W.C. Durin this Eastertide it is lighted Solemn Mass and Vespers Sundays, but on Ascension Day after the Gospel, it is finally extinguished and is removed from the sanctuary.
