## AGRICULTURE.

NEW PLAN FOR RIPENING Paul ON TREES.—The last number of the Paris Journal d'Agricalture de l'Aia gives a plan for forwarding the ripening of faut, on tree.— Every one connected with horticulture knows that there exists on trees two kinds of sap, one rising and the other failing; the former nourishing the wood, and the latte the flowers and the front. The process alluded to consists in binding tightly round the lower part of the branch, on which the front is, a piece of wire, in order to stop the descending sap, which, thus arrested in its rrogress, flows with greatabun ance to the fruit, increases its size, and bought it to maturity a folloight or three weeks earlier than in the natural way.
