

HUDSON'S BAY CO. TO ENTER TORONTO

Report is Believed That They Will Establish a Big Store in the Queen City in the Course of the Next Few Months.

Toronto, Sept. 14.—The report published a short time ago, that the Hudson's Bay company, acting in cooperation with the Canadian Northern, is the real power that is moving toward the acquisition of the immense Carlton-Yonge-Alexander-Church block, is revived today with convincing force.

When the T. Eaton company located in Winnipeg, it cut into a retail patronage which the Hudson's Bay company stores had regarded for years as their own particular possessions.

At the last annual meeting of the directors of the Hudson's Bay company, Mr. William Mackenzie, president of the C. N. R., and Mr. Cohen, proprietor of the largest departmental store in London, England, were elected members of the board.
