 payers. This is really a provision
 by-law. Twenty years is the long-
 est period for which debentures may
 be issued under the present munici-
 pal ordinance, and so it is proposed
 to have a special act passed at the
 next session of the Alberta Legisla-
 ture, authorizing the issue of forty
 year debentures, which will retire
 the present issue. A ballot will be
 taken on voting day, leaving the
 Legislature to pass such an act.
 Tenders for the supply of sewer
 and water pipes were called on April
 1st, and contracts will be let the day
 after the by-law is ratified by the
 people. There is no doubt but
 what the town will vote unanimously
 in favor of this much-needed im-
 provement.

Railroad Era at Hand.
 With the opening of spring there
 is every indication that the railway
 era for Camrose is at hand. The
 G.T.P. and C.N.R. have both secured
 right of way and station sites in Cal-
 gary and from lines from Tofield and
 Vegreville. For over half the dis-
 tance on both lines the grading has
 been done and the track laid. The
 C.N.R. officials have given con-
 tracts for the completion of the line
 to Calgary, and have instructed the
 contractors to push this portion of
 the season's work with all possible
 speed. It is reported that a crew
 will commence this week on ballast-
 ing the G.T.P. line from Tofield to
 the Red Deer river, and that the
 will be just in putting the road-bed
 into shape for traffic. The officials
 of both railway lines have promised
 through Camrose by June. This
 will give Camrose connection with
 the C.N.R. and T.P. mail and ex-
 press service. The connection
 with Calgary cannot be secured un-
 til the line to the south is com-
 pleted, consequently the activity of
 the construction camps will be
 regular all the way to the south. The
 month of June is also associated
 with the inauguration of a thorough
 service over the C.P.R. from Winnipeg
 to Calgary. The sitting of the Court of Appeal
 in connection with the new Camrose
 assessment lasted only thirty minutes,
 as a result only two minor revisions
 were made.

Big Demand for Horses.
 The demand for horses at a recent
 description was shown in Camrose on
 Saturday last at "Laving's" auction
 sale. All the horses went at good
 prices, the roadsters realizing from
 \$100 to \$150, and a heavy draft team
 \$500. Altogether \$7,000 was re-
 ceived with not an article left un-
 sold. Within the past week three
 purebred Percheron and one pure-
 bred Belgian stallions from Hunter
 farm, at Olds, have been sold in the
 Camrose district, for \$2,000 to
 \$3,000 each. It is stated that arrange-
 ments have been completed for a road
 connecting with the C.N.R. at Camrose,
 and running in a south-westerly direc-
 tion, touching Hastings Coulee, Gal-
 lant and Flagstaff and on to Brown-
 head, connecting with the C.N.R. line
 between Calgary and Moose Jaw. It is the intention
 to give the work to farmers in the town
 of large land interests at the coast. It
 is understood he will enter the real es-
 tate business here this summer.

 the C.N.R.) and the Carvel town-
 site (on the G.T.P.) will only be 11
 miles apart. It is the intention of
 the councillors also, to put a good
