COMMERCIAL GUELPH MARKETS.

GUELPH, Jan. 16, 1873.
 Our market, during the past week, has been well attended, and a very large quantity of produce has changed hands. Grain of all descriptions has been steady, without any upward tendency. Pork, large quantities of which came in, has slightly advanced in price, and is now quoted at from \$4.50 to \$5.35, the latter figure being paid for the best quality. Hogs weighing up to 250 pounds each are eagerly sought after, while hogs weighing 400 lbs. and upwards rarely meet with a purchaser. Hay has been in good supply at former quotations, while straw is still exceedingly scarce. We may add that the strictest attention is paid to our market reports which are corrected daily, and are therefore perfectly reliable. The following are today's quotations:
