TOO MANY LUNATICS AND PAUPERS IN JAIL.

Sarnia, Sept. 30.—The jury sittings of the high court began here today, the chancellor presiding. In his charge to the grand jury his lordship commented on the large number of paupers and lunatics in the jail. There is a poorhouse in the county, but it is not open to paupers, only to poor who are able to pay something for their board, but that those who reach the extremity of poverty go to jail. The lunatics are in jail pending their admission to an asylum, but the asylums are full. His lordship does not think there is any increase in insanity. He thinks the people formerly bore with their insane and cared for them at home, but that now they prefer to get them into the public asylums, where they receive better care. But the county jail is not an asylum, and the condition of lunatics so confined is deplorable. The provincial government, his lordship said, has already done much, but they must do more for the insane.
