MULLOY'S EVIDENCE FLATLY DENIED

Member of "Buffalo Gang" Is Contradicted in Bribery Story.

Owen Sound, Sept. 15.—The third day of the North Grey election trial did not develop anything of a very startling nature that was not pretty well known previously. Cap. Sullivan was present at today's proceedings, but was not called. Mulloy, one of the Buffalo gang, was the first witness called. He went over a good deal of the same ground as Nelson, did yesterday. He told of his driving out twelve miles from Warton to one McIvor's, where a voter named McAllister lived, who was to be bought; when he arrived, McAllister had retired for the night, and gave \$25 to McIvor, together with some whisky and cigars. \$15 was for McIvor and \$10 for McAllister. This story was flatly contradicted by McIvor, who swore that Mulloy never came to his house with money, whisky or cigars. One, Graham, of Brookholm, a suburb of Owen Sound, also told how some unknown came to him at his house the night previous to the election and gave him \$25 to vote for McKay, which he afterwards brought the same \$25 down to H. G. Tucker, a prominent Conservative solicitor of the town, for advice how to act in the matter. Judgment in both of these counts was reserved, and court adjourned until tomorrow morning.

DUNDONALD COMING BACK

Has Purchased Estate From Clark Heirs at the Capital.

Ottawa, Ont., Sept. 15.—The Earl of Dundonald has completed the purchase from the Clark heirs of Creighton Lodge, his late beautiful residence adjoining Rideau Hall. The place will henceforth be known as Cochrane Lodge. The property comprises twenty acres of ground, mostly wooded, and additions and improvements to the residence will be proceeded almost immediately. Lord Dundonald is an ardent sportsman, but owing to his earnest and devoted attention to his work during his two years' stay in Canada, he was unable to visit the hunting grounds. It is within the bounds of possibility, however, that he may return to Canada this fall to have some deer hunting, but in that event will take no part in politics should the elections come on.

GARTUNG DISCHARGED

C. O. F. Made Restitution and Order Wrote Not Prosecute.

Brantford, Ont., Sept. 15.—Ernest Gartung, charged with wrongfully converting \$1,680 of the funds of the Canadian Order of Foresters to his own use, was arraigned before Judge Hardy for trial at the court house in this city today.

The prisoner entered a plea of not guilty.

"The party convention has nominated Mr. Clarke in my place, and I step down and out."
