PELLETIER ANGERED BY FOSTER OFFERED HIS RESIGNATION

Delay In Bringing Down the Supplementary Estimates Due to Row Between Postmaster-General and Trades Minister Over Proposal to Increase Postal Employees.

[Special to The Advertiser.] Ottawa, March 22.—The supplementary estimates have been strangely delayed. A story from reliable sources is current in the lobbies of Parliament which gives the explanation. Hon. L. P. Pelletier, the postmaster-general, had so strong a difference with some members of the Government that he intimated to Premier Borden his desire to leave the Government. Mr. Pelletier has been pressing for heavy increases of pay for employees in some of the postoffices, including Quebec and Montreal. These increases were opposed by Finance Minister White, ex-Finance Minister Foster and some other members of the Government, who said that they were willing to have the increases made for Toronto, but not for other postoffices whose revenue was less. "It will be all or none," was the reply of the Postmaster-General. "Then it will be none," retorted Mr. Foster. This ended the row in the cabinet, but Mr. Pelletier felt so badly at being insulted that he immediately went to Mr. Borden with the offer of his resignation, that he might separate himself from association with him. Premier Borden is reported to have persuaded Mr. Pelletier not to put in his resignation for the present, at least. There is great interest in seeing if Mr. Pelletier will eventually get his way. The supplementary estimates, which will be down next week, will show whether there are postoffice increases or that the Ontario members have had their way and suppressed them. LIBERALS DETECT A GOVT. TRICK

Mr. Carvell Says an Effort Is Being Made To Prevent an Investigation.

LONG FIGHT THREATENED

Public Accounts Suddenly Revived When Too Late To Be of Use to Country.

[Special to The Advertiser.] Ottawa, March 22.—Parliament threatens to stay and fight instead of closing up with the winter and disappearing with the snow. The public accounts committee has again bobbed up as a storm centre, and its trouble, instead of staying decently in its own premises, slopped over into the House. E. B. Carvell, the fighting member from New Brunswick, delivered the trouble to the Commons. He said that the public accounts committee, which had been dormant all session, had been revived or aroused just as Parliament was scheduled to prorogue. "Wants a Probe." Mr. Middlebro, the new Conservative chairman, was responsible for this and he had political motives as his motive. He wanted to have the transactions of the Diamond Light and Heating Company, of Montreal, with the late Government investigated, or rather, half investigated. Mr. Carvell said that Mr. Middlebro's scheme was to have the attack on the company made public, and then have Parliament prorogue before there was time for witnesses to be examined who could give explanations. "I tell gentlemen opposite," said Mr. Carvell, "that if they expect prorogation by Easter they will let this matter lie until next session, when I will bring it before the committee and have it investigated thoroughly." "The honorable gentleman" has adopted the wrong tone, said Mr. Borden. "We are not to be deterred by threats. This is the first I have heard of this case, but I do not like the tone adopted by the member from New Brunswick."

Mr. Middlebro said that he had seen in a Montreal paper a statement by the manager of the Diamond Light and Heating Company, that its whole business amounted to \$100,000, and of this all but \$3,000 was taken by the Government, and to get that it had to pay commissions amounting to \$41,000. He thought that no time should be lost investigating this. The Conservatives could produce their evidence, Parliament could produce theirs, and the Liberals would then have six months in which to prepare their defence. "That would mean that the charge would go to the country, and while there may be a complete refutation, we would have no opportunity to set it before the country for six weeks," said Mr. Carvell. Mr. Kyte (Liberal), declared that if the case was opened, the Liberals would keep the House sitting until it was finished. Mr. Blain (Conservative), said that the Government supporters were not insisting upon going home. Dr. Clark (Liberal), said that he thought the matter should be peace-

CATTLE PRICES AT TORONTO MARKET

TORONTO, March 22.—The bidding at the regular Wednesday sale held at the Union stockyards was not as brisk as usual, owing to the general dullness of the horse trade. However, out of the large number offered, sales were made of over 40 head. Horses were bought for local and western and Montreal shipment. J. W. Jacobs bought a load for Montreal, Arthur Davidson bought a load for Montreal, and H. Hambly a part load for Gull Lake, Sask., besides those made for the local trade and for shipment to country points in Ontario. Two loads of horses that were expected in for this sale were delayed on the road and did not arrive in time, but are expected in almost any time, and will be offered at private sale.
