In order that we may proceed with this develop-ment, it will be absolutely necessary to secure access to the American markets by a route that will put us in a position to successfully compete with the coal and coke producers already in the field. If denied access to the American mark kets except by roundabout routes, if de-layed in our operations by legislative ob-struction, if prevented in any way from cutting down the cost of production to the narrowest possible margin, our suc-cess on the field will be morportionately.
