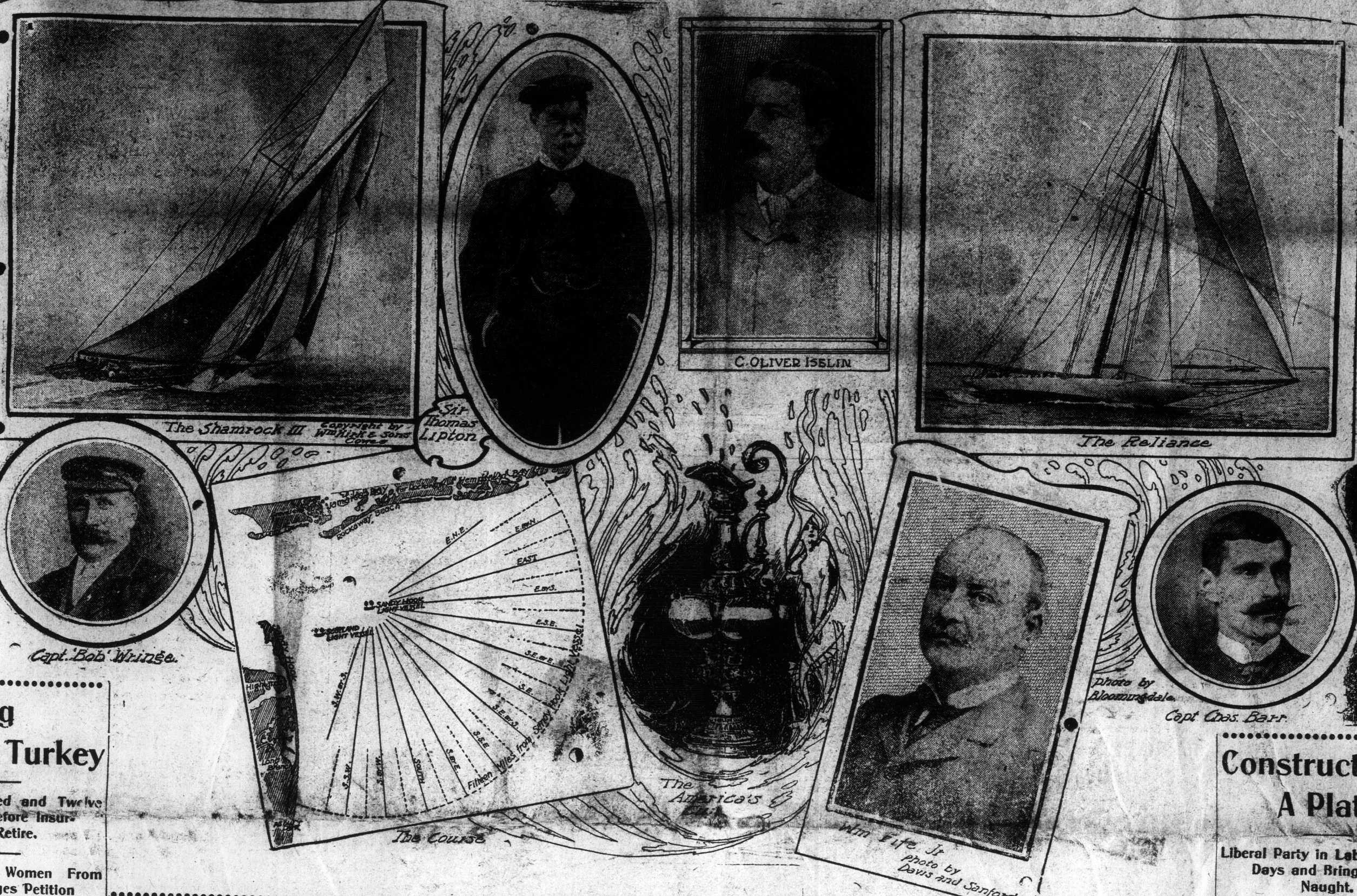

Denver, Aug. 19.—A special to the Times from Rawlins, Wyo., says that James Williams, a convict, was shot to death in his cell at the state penitentiary yesterday by Ernest Goodsell, night turnkey. Reaching through the bars Williams seized Goodsell and wrestled the keys from his hands. After a struggle Goodsell succeeded in drawing his revolver and shot the convict in the head.

Decline in Whiskey Prices.

Peoria, Aug. 19.—Trouble is evidently brewing between the independent and crop distillers for this morning the whiskey quotation was dropped from 123, the basis for finished goods, to 124, a decline of 3 cents per gallon.

Outbreak at Croatia.

Vienna, Aug. 19.—A fresh outbreak of rioting occurred at Croatia, at Senj, upon the occasion of the celebration of the birthday of Emperor Francis Joseph, and today a thousand peasants gathered in the town and destroyed a Hungarian banner. The rioters were resisted by the gendarmes, who shot three men and wounded many others.
