prisoners of war was sent to Lady Le-

Blanc, wife of the Lieutenant Gov-

ernor, and helped swell the amount

which the Duchess of Connaught spent

for our prisoners of war. After this

sum had been disposed of, the Society

only had twenty-five (\$0.25) cents in

hand. Since then, October 1st 1916,

as shown in the above statement,

the sum of \$728.90 has been realized.

Needless to say that this has not been

done without considerable effort, and

was only made possible by the kind

and hearty co-operation of one and

all. Too much praise cannot be ex-

tended to our zealous President, Mrs.

George Kempfer who succeeded in

collecting the sum of \$149.03 which

was expended in sending sixty-seven

Christmas boxes to our boys at the
