## A HOT FIRE AT HUNTSVILLE

THE BUSINESS POUTION OF THE VILLAGE IN ASHES.

The List of Burned Buildings Includes 32 Business Houses, Besides a Church, Hotel, Grist Mill and a Steamer -The Loss Will Reach Fully \$120,000-

Many People Homeless. HUNTSVILLE, Ont., April 18 .- About 12.10 to-day a rubbish heap was being burned in rear of H. S. May's hardware store, and the flames spread to the shop. Before it could be extinguished the blaze was communicated to some coal oil barrels near by and then Mr. May's store building. From this it spread to the whole business places in the easterly part of the main street, and in less than two hours the whole

was in ashes. The burned buildings comprise one hotel, grist mill and thirty-two business places, also the Episcopal Church, telegraph, telephone and postoffice and the steamer Excelsior, owned by G. F. Marsh.

The fire engines from Gravenhurst and Bracebridge came, but too late to save any-
