The Hydro-Electric System is selling 544,000 horse-power of energy derived from water-power to 335,000 customers. In 1915 the output was 104,000 horse-power, sold to 120,000 customers. The average rate is the lowest in the world. The service is reliable and of the highest grade and the demand is steadily increasing throughout all the Province.

The amount of coal required to generate one horse-power of continuous electrical energy varies from 6, to 32 tons in accordance with the efficiency of the plant. In a generating station producing 100,000 horse-power under the most modern and economical conditions a consumption of 6 tons.

station producing 100,000 horse-power under the most modern and economical conditions a consumption of 6 tons has been registered. But this is as exceptional, as is the 32 tons needed by an ancient boiler wastefully fired. There is authority to justify the use of 20 tons as an average, but to be on the conservative side, let it be supposed that one hydraulically produced horse-power is the equivalent of 10 tons of coal.

Then the present production of the Hydro-Electric System is equal to 5,440,000 tons of steam coal per annum which is worth at present prices more than Fifty Millions of Dollars. The customers of the "Hydro" pay for their service about \$10,000,000 a year, so that co-operative municipal ownership is saving the people of Ontario fully \$40,000,000 a year and is reducing the production-cost of all manner of manufactured goods.

Furthermore the reduction in the demand for steam coal by reason of the use of "Hydro" power is lessening materially the burden on the railways. It would take 136,000 cars to transport 5,440,000 tons of coal at 40 tons

It would take 136,000 cars to transport 5,440,000 tons of coal at 40 tons to the car. That is the equivalent of a train 1,030 miles long—or of one train 3 miles long every day in the

year.




