EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION.

DUES.--The dues of the Association shall be 25c. per year, payable on the 1st of January, in advance. The fiscal year shall commence on the 1st of January. All new members who shall be elected between the 1st of January and the 1st of July shall pay 25c. dues; all who shall be elected between the 1st of July and the 1st of January shall pay 10c. for dues to the next 1st of January in advance.
