leave to remark that it is not always sufficient to give a general recommendation from the pulpit. If success is to be obtained it is by appointing persons who shall call upon the different families in the congregation personally. The following remarks from the United Presbyterian Blagazine are to the purpose:—

"Let a small canvassiny Committee be formed in each congregation, after recommendation from the pulpit to wait on every family and respectfully solicit their support, and they will meet with comparatively fow refusals. Other plans have been tried in extending the circulation of denominational magazines, but no other has been so successful as that now suggested. Mere announcement will not suffice. In a case known to the Committee, it was intimated that intending subscribers might put their names in the plate on Sabbath and only two were received. But in the same Churck three hundred and fifty subscribers were secured by waiting personally on the members. If this plan, or some similar one, is pursued, the desired increase will be very readily obtained."

We commend this view to our brethren throughout the Church. The matter might, we think, be managed by the elders in their several districts, or by appointing some young and active person in each section of the congregation to act as agents. Whatever plan be adopted we request that the ministers will see that personal agency, and not announcements merely, be employed to accomplish the object.

We have also to request that agents forward as speedily as possible the balances due for 1856, as we wish to close the accounts for that

year.
