## Book Notices.

**SOUTHEY'S LIFE OF NELSON.** Edited, with an Introduction and Notes, by Albert L. Blaisdell. x + 242 pages. Ginn & Company, Publishers, Boston, Mass.

Judged from a strictly historical point of view, Southey's "Life of Nelson" has no great value; but the fact that it has retained its charm for readers, both young and old, for more than eighty years easily puts it in the first rank of readable and popular biographies. Southey was master of a style which has always commanded admiration for its clearness, vigor, and simplicity. He was fortunate in his subject. He wrote the life of England's greatest admiral, a man of commanding genius, whose remarkable exploits in the naval service of his country made him a popular hero while he lived, and has endeared his memory to mankind for nearly a century.

In this edition of Southey's masterpiece, which is more particularly intended for school use, the editor has prepared an introduction, and supplemented the text with a suitable number of notes. A few passages, which have little or no interest at the present time, have been omitted.
