

#### EASTERN CANADA CIVIC NOTES.

OTTAWA, ONT. A refinery in connection with the Royal Mint, is to be

COBALT, ONT. The provincial board of health has approved of the plans for a waterworks system and sewage dis-

LONDON, ONT., Township has been added to the list of municipalities in which local option will be voted on. It is one of the most populous townships in Ontario.

OTTAWA, ONT. According to the new directory the population is 86,889, an increase of 1,556 in the year.

SARNIA, ONT. It is expected that the mains will be laid and natural gas ready for distribution by the first week in December.

PRESTON, ONT. The by-law for the extension of the waterworks was voted on and carried. The by-law for the purchase of the Weinberg property of eighty-two acres for the purpose of extending Speed Park was also voted on and was carried by a large majority. ST. JOHN WEST, N. B. The federal

public works department has completed borings on the site of the proposed new steamship berths and found the bottom favorable for dredging. Boring is now resumed at Courtenay Bay to determine the location of the proposed docks there.

SARNIA, ONT. The customs author-

tities have placed a female officer on duty at the local ferry wharf. PORT ARTHUR, ONT. The Roman Catholics have planned a new cathedral to be commenced early next year, the material to be purchased during

the fall and winter.

LONDON, ONT., has raised the dog tax from \$1 to \$2, and if not paid June 1st it will be \$3.

PORT ARTHUR, ONT. The Western Dry dock and Shipbuilding Company will build a dry dock and shipbuilding plant within the northern limits of the city costing about \$1,000,000. Nine other by-laws were passed, one giving a free site to the Stanworth-Martin Company, stonecutters. Others were for the extension of the sewer and water systems and double tracking the street railway. Waverley Park was selected as the site

for the Carnegie Library.

LONDON, ONT. The plans for the new sanitarium for consumptives to be erected by the London Health Association have been approved by the Provincial Secretary's department and the Provincial Architect. The new hospital will, it is said, excel any similar insti-

tutions in the country.
