CRIMINAL CODE AMENDMENT ACT, 1985

MEASURE TO ENACT

Mr. Scott Fennell (Ontario) moved for leave to introduce Bill C-240, an Act to amend the Criminal Code (capital punishment).

Mr. Speaker: Shall the Hon. Member have leave to introduce the said Bill?

Some Hon. Members: Agreed.

Mr. Fennell: Mr. Speaker, it is my pleasure at this time to introduce this Private Members' Bill. The purpose of the Bill is to restore the death penalty for substantiated first degree murder and high treason. The Bill also provides for a more humane method of implementing the punishment.

CRIME VICTIMS ASSISTANCE ACT

MEASURE TO ENACT

Mr. Howard Crosby (Halifax West) moved for leave to introduce Bill C-241, an Act to provide assistance for victims of crime.

Mr. Speaker: Shall the Hon. Member have leave to introduce the said Bill?

Some Hon. Members: Agreed.

Mr. Crosby: Mr. Speaker, this Bill enacts a new statute called the Crime Victims Assistance Act. The provisions require that a crime victim be kept informed respecting the investigation of the crime and the prosecution of the offender. At present, the victim has no status in the legal process.
