Mr. Gibson (Hamilton West), a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of March 10, 1949, for a Return showing:—1. What are the names of the legal firms and solicitors in the County of Hastings (a) receiving fees from the Dominion Government or any of its commissions from 1st January, 1946, to date; (b) to whom any fees are still due and payable?

2. What amounts have been paid to each of them, in what year, and for

what services?

3. What amounts are still due to each, and for what services?

4. What are the names of the legal firms and solicitors in the County of Hastings, at present employed by the Dominion Government or any of its commissions?

And also,—Return to an Order of the House of April 25, 1949, for a Return showing:—1. Does the Federal Government own any building at Williams Lake? If so, what are the particulars and value?

2. Does the Federal Government rent any building or buildings at Williams Lake? If so, what are the particulars?

3. What departments, branches, or agencies of the Federal Government have permanent office space in Williams Lake, or require intermittent accommodation there in connection with the public service?

4. What is the total annual building rental paid in Williams Lake by the Federal Government?

Mr. Winters, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General of April 25, 1949, for a copy of all letters, telegrams and other documents in connection with negotiations between Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and the city of Toronto and the Province of Ontario, in 1946-47-48, in connection with the grant for \$1,150,000 to assist in slum clearance in the city of Toronto.

On motion of Mr. McIlraith, it was ordered,—That the petition for a private bill of Raymond Lees Hughes and others, of Toronto, Ontario, presented on April 25, 1949, together with the report made thereon by the Clerk of Petitions on April 26, 1949, be referred to the Standing Committee on Standing Orders for such recommendations as may be deemed advisable.

On motion of Mr. MacLean, it was ordered,—That the Standing Committee on Standing Orders be granted leave to sit while the House is sitting.

The House then resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Abbott: That Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair for the House to resolve itself again into Committee of Ways and Means, and on the proposed motion of Mr. Macdonnell (Muskoka-Ontario), in amendment thereto, and on the proposed motion of Mr. Coldwell, in amendment to the said proposed amendment.
