My dear Sir Arthur,



This girl was all that could be desired in every way, but Miss Cumming has made up her mind that she cannot again accept any girl of Jewish blood. Since admitting this pupil she has been overwhelmed with applications from Jews, and her opinion is that in the future it would be easier and wiser to refuse in every case.

Dr. Fraser, who was with me when I saw Miss Cumming, agrees accordingly.

The matter might be brought up and discussed at the next Meeting of the Board, and the finding entered in the Minutes.
