

suffer any sort of counteraction, direct or indirect, to be made to it by their citizens, or respective subjects; and the Contracting Parties guarantee, generally and reciprocally, all the stipulations of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XXII.

The present Treaty to be ratified by the Contracting Parties in thirty days, or sooner, if possible, and the Ratifications shall be exchanged, in due form, at Paris.

In testimony whereof, we, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries, have signed with our hands, and in virtue of our respective full powers, the present Definitive Treaty, causing it to be sealed with our respective seals.

Done at Amiens, March 27, 1802, the 4th Germinal, in the year 10 of the French Republic.
