lieutenant-governor, (2) direct taxation, (3) borrowing of money for the province, (4) civil service of the province, (5) the pub lands, if the province owns its lands, (6) t prisons and reformatories of the province, hospitals, asylums, and charitable institution (8) municipal institutions, (9) licenses such those of taverns, shops, and auctioneers, (1 local works and undertakings, except lines steamships, railways, canals, telegraphs, an other works and undertakings extending outsid the province, and such works which, althoug wholly inside the province, are declared by th Dominion parliament to be for the genera advantage of Canada, (11) the incorporation of companies for business in the province, (12) the solemnization of marriage, (13) property and civil rights, (14) the administration of justice and procedure in civil matters in the courts (15) punishment by fine and imprisonment, in case any provincial law is broken, and (16) generally all matters of a merely local or private nature.

The subject of education must be added to this provincial list. But if a province before
