BEHRING SEA HURRICANE

Three Steamers Lost, Involving Deto the Value of \$120,000.

San Francisco, July 18.—It was reported at St. Michael on July 7, when the St. Paul saided for this city, that the Come maugh from Seattle was overtaken in the Behring Sea by a hurricane and her tow, a river steamer, laden with steers, was lost. Steamer and cargo were valued at \$40,000. Two barges towed by the Alassia Commercial Company's steamer Portland were lost in the same storm. They cost about \$20,000. A similar fate overtook an ew river boat, towed by the National City. The loss in the last case was \$50,000. Only four river steamers had come down the Yukon at the date of the St. Paul's departure. The May West left Dawson June 19, and arrived at St. Michael July 3, with 225 passengers. The steamer Hamliton left Dawson June 24, and the B. B. Weare June 25, both arriving at St. Michael July 5, the Hamilton being in tow of the Weare, having broken her chains combing down the river. The Hamilton held passengers, and the Weare about 15. The Yukon is unusually low this season, and boats that are already at St. Michael have slight chances of reaching Dawson, and boats that are already at St. Michael have slight chances of reaching Dawson. 
