

FORMER SOLDIERS TO GET TRANSPORTATION FOR OVERSEAS TRIP

Ex-Members of C. E. F. To Be Furnished Passage by Militia Dept.

DISCHARGES OVER THERE

Faulty System Forces Many To Return To Canada Unwillingly.

Although it is not generally known and no local men so far have taken advantage of it, ex-members of the Canadian Expeditionary Force, who for various reasons were not given an opportunity to take their discharge overseas, will be given transportation to England under the federal emergency repatriation act, according to an announcement made by F. S. Fisher, the unit service officer of the information and service branch of the D. S. C. E. Many men were not given their discharge in England because of their ignorance of the fact that they were entitled to it, or because of some error on the part of the military authorities they were returned to Canada because of the army regulations requiring men who required further medical treatment for certain disabilities to return home.

It is known that there are many men who, under the army regulations, had to be brought back to Canada for discharge, but who owing to the fact that the military authorities had moved to their parts of the world, have found themselves now at a disadvantage as regards the taking up permanent employment in Canada, and are now desirous of rejoining their families. These men, if their case warrants it, can receive assistance under the plan.

The administrator of the federal emergency repatriation act may issue the necessary transportation, but no money assistance to the men coming under these classes. Careful investigation will be made in each instance by the department of militia and defence and the patriotic fund committee. Where it is discovered that the withholding of the transportation would be an injustice, and where the means of re-establishing such men in civil life, the transportation will be supplied.

All applications for transportation must be made through the service officers of the information and service branch, and must be sent in and forwarded to Ottawa not later than April 20.

Average Living Expense Figured At \$27 Per Child.

An average living expense of \$27 for each child in the Children's Aid Society's shelter was shown by the report for this month. Sixteen boys and ten girls were being cared for at the beginning of the month. Three more boys and six girls were admitted, while two boys and two girls were placed in foster homes, leaving 31 in the shelter at the end of the month.

Total expenses for food and supplies were \$938. This included an old bill for coal, making the actual expense of the month about \$800. This is considered a good showing in the face of the rising cost. Generous donations of supplies have greatly helped in carrying on the work of the institution.

IF FLOUR PRICES ADVANCE, BREAD GOES UP TOO

The Canadian Millers Declare They Are Operating At Loss.

London bakers have not been considering further advances in the price of bread—but bread will advance if price of flour advances. Press dispatches this morning that the Canadian millers were asking the government to permit them to raise the price of flour a trifle more or less, on the ground that they simply cannot manufacture their product and operate their mills without losing money at present flour prices. The first intimation that several local bakers heard of the millers' intention to raise the cost of living a little bit more.

While the bakers have been quite content with the present bread prices, they point out that they have been making bread at a close margin of profit, (everybody is working on a slightly close margin, of profit these days, the ultimate consumer excepted who works on a margin of loss), and if the price of flour advances, bread will have to advance also.

The advance to the millers hasn't been granted yet, but then they tell a sorry tale of mills being forced to close down and thousands of men thrown out of work. So the hapless consumer who even has to pay more for handkerchiefs and soap, will be expected to pay more for bread.

Besides the probable increase in flour prices, the journeymen bakers are negotiating for day work at night prices. This will be another reason for bread advancing in price.

COLDER AND WARMER, ALSO MUCH DRIER
March This Year Puts 1919 To Shame.

March this year was a colder month, a warmer month, and a drier month than March, 1919. In fact it excelled that month in so many ways that it is a fair challenge to the record of the month of March, 1919.

According to official figures from the weather bureau the highest temperature attained during the past month was on the 26th day, when the mercury reached 71 degrees. The lowest temperature was three days previously on the 22nd when it fell far below freezing point to two degrees below zero.

The rainfall was only .083 inches, while the snowfall was only three and three-quarter inches.

In March, 1919, the highest temperature attained was 61 degrees on the 26th, and the lowest 12 degrees on the 7th. The rainfall was 4.10 inches, and the snowfall five inches.

The disappearance yesterday of Evelyn Bertin, a fourteen-year-old school girl, coupled with the knowledge that her father, who lives in Windsor, was in constant fear that she might be kidnapped by her mother, from whom he separated some time ago, led to the belief that she actually had been abducted. The police were notified, and a search was instituted, but at 5 o'clock in the evening the girl was returned to the home of her guardian, Mrs. Peter Baccara, with the explanation that she had been riding around the city in street cars all day.

The child left as usual for school in the morning. Lester Anne Baccara, a daughter of Evelyn's guardian, reported that she had seen the child with her mother, who is said to reside in Rochester, N. Y. A similar report by a neighbor, confirmed Mrs. Baccara's suspicions, and she at once notified the police, and the missing girl's father, inquiries early elicited the fact that Evelyn had not been to school, and the search was on.

Last evening, upon her return, Evelyn at first stated, when asked that she had been to school, confronted with the fact that the contrary had been secured, she broke down completely, but no information could be secured from her save that she had boarded an Oxford car and had gone out to see the city. Later on, according to Mrs. Baccara, she asked to be allowed to visit her mother, but the request was refused after a long-distance telephone consultation with her father.

Father Is Wealthy

The youngest, aged two, was sent to Detroit, where she was placed in the care of a friend of the father. BUILDING PERMITS FOR APRIL ARE OFF TO START OF \$18,000

Indications Point To Record Month, Says Inspector.

MUCH BUILDING

Well Ahead of Last Year's Figures—Several Permits Today.

Building permits totaling more than \$18,000 were issued by Building Inspector A. M. Piper today as a sendoff for the month.

"Indications point to a record month," he said. "It is likely that quite a large amount of building will be commenced this month in spite of the high prices. We are well ahead of last year's figures and there is every reason to expect that this month will maintain the record. It should be remembered, however, that prices are not higher than last year, and while the amount of money paid for building seems larger, the actual construction is not much greater."

The Bank of Montreal was granted a permit to remodel a store at the northwest corner of Dundas and Wellington street for bank purposes. A stone front will be placed on the building at a cost of \$15,000.

The housing commission took out a permit to erect a 14-story brick apartment building for William H. Martin at Talbot and Huron streets. The cost of this will be \$3,500, which is considerably below prices now being given for houses. The contract for this dwelling was let last year.

Several smaller permits bring the total to \$18,780, making a total for the year thus far of \$181,580. In April last year permits to the value of \$187,000 worth of building were issued.

BANK CLEARINGS SHOW INCREASE OF FIVE MILLIONS
The Figures For March Total \$15,572,717.

The bank clearings for the month of March show an increase of nearly \$5,000,000 over that of the same period last year. The London Clearing Bank, Limited, reported that the increase was the largest government business in the way of gratuity and pension checks to be cleared in the year was \$15,572,717, and for the corresponding week last year were \$10,572,555.

CHICAGO FIREMEN VOTE TO RESIGN
