NOT A SUICIDE

But Jury Unable to Determine Manner of Mrs. Burns' Death.

BAYFIELD, July 22.—(Special.)—That she came to her death from causes unknown to them, but that she did not commit suicide, was the verdict of the jury empaneled by Coroner Dr. Shaw of Clinton to enquire into the death of Mrs. W. J. Burns of this village, who was found dead in her house with a stocking knotted around her throat on Saturday last.

The jury convened here this afternoon and after hearing the medical evidence produced by Crown Attorney Seagar of Goderich, which went to show that there was no evidence of death by strangulation, brought in the above verdict.

A jurymen suggested that a hand rail be put on the top of freight cars beside the running board.

"A man working on the railway takes his life in his hands," commented the coroner. "Terribly dangerous life," he said.

Dr. J. M. Cotton performed the post mortem examination. W. W. Pope appeared for the railway, and T. L. Monahan acted for the crown.
