Berlin, Oct. 26.—The American jockey, George Archibald, who rode Geo. K. Aiken when he won the \$10,000 Dominion Handicap at Port Erie, has been released from his employment in Baron Oppenheim's stables and will now ride the horses of Prince Hohenlohe Oehringen in Austria, where a license has been secured for him.

Racing in France
Shows Great Strength

The French turf paper, "Le Jockey," Paris, of October 3 publishes terms of stallions in service for 1918, which serves to show the value of high-class war-horses of the truck in still fully recognized. The premiums Prince Pauline and Sundridge are at private terms, but J. D. Cohn's grand young horse Teddy is a fee of \$2000. The king of Spain's crack Antivar has also gone into similar retirement and stands at a fee of \$1200. The fees of the sires at Mrs. H. R. Duryea's Haras du Caumon are respectively: Durbar, \$1000; Sweeper, \$400; Shannon, \$200 and Charet, \$200. Along with Teddy at Haras du Caumon are Mon Pedet, at \$400, and the Irishman, at \$100. The latter is practically American-bred, being a young horse by Irish Lad-Miniberia. The famous horse, Prestige, stands at \$700. Stires with progeny racing in this country are Halcorn, San Antonio and Mordant, each at \$240. At Chantilly, October 1, W. K. Vanderbilt's two-year-old Mastery, by Mainton-Maskette, proved himself a good one when he won the Prix D'Orby at three-quarters of a mile in 1:12 2-5. He carried 123 pounds, won by three lengths and defeated eighteen of the best of the year. T. P. Thorne's L'Etranger finished second.
