

The Dummer report says we are living in peace and unity, and evidencing an increase of denominational zeal, as shown by an increase of Missionary and Quarterly receipts. One of the greatest obstacles in the way of prosperity is the want of more spacious and inviting meeting-houses in which to worship God.

In Seymour Mission gratitude is expressed to God for his presence manifested in their assemblies; a few have professed faith in the Saviour: both the Quarterly and Missionary receipts are greatly in advance of last year; and they express the hope of soon ceasing to draw so heavily from the Mission Fund.

The Pastor of Huntingdon says "Though we have not had great prosperity, yet we have not labored in vain. Believers have found the word very precious; and unbelievers have found it both a hammer and a sword, and, yielding to its power, have become new creatures in Christ. Peace has generally prevailed in our Societies; our congregations are good, and our finances in a healthy state."

In Hungerford they express gratitude to God for the manifestations of his presence and power in the conversion of some precious souls. The congregations are good; but they cannot look forward with hopes of great success unless they can have a second preacher to assist in properly working the ground occupied.

From Perrytown we hear of the Societies living in peace, and realizing the gracious influences of the Holy Spirit; one new place has been opened with good prospects, and a Sabbath School has been organized; but the Pastor mourns over the Laodicean state of some of the members, evidenced in their neglect of the social means of grace, more especially class and prayer-meetings. Financially they have done well.

The Report of Pickering Mission thankfully acknowledges the goodness of God during the year. Two Chapel debts have been paid off, and the Quarterly and Missionary receipts are considerably in advance of last year. Spiritually, the station is taking higher ground: a decided improvement is reported numerically, with expectations of its continuance. They regret the want of more local assistance in working the station properly, and ardent prayer is breathed for an increase of this useful staff of laborers.

The Scott Mission Report also complains of the lack of Local help, and regrets many disappointments through the winter. They are encouraged by the increased liberality of the friends, and a Bible Class which has been well attended during the year.

In Oshawa, though they have not witnessed any remarkable outpouring of the Spirit, resulting in large ingatherings to the Church, yet they report "seasons of refreshing coming from the presence of the Lord," cheering the despondent, strengthening the weak, and making those of a fearful heart to be strong. They have heard the penitent's cry for mercy, and the jubilant songs of new-born souls. Two left the Church militant to join the triumphant hosts above. They have lessened the debt on their Chapel about \$300 during the year, and are in advance in Quarterly and Missionary receipts. The Sabbath School manifests a very cheering and encouraging aspect in all its departments.

In Prince Albert the influence of the Holy Spirit is gratefully acknowledged, accompanied with earnest breathings for more of the mind which was in Christ, as a preparation for greater usefulness and future prosperity. Financially they have done well. There are four Sabbath Schools in good working order. The Report says this Mission cannot be efficiently worked without a second Preach-
