That the State of Maine will stand behind President Wilson and is enthusiastic over the war outlook, was shown in Bangor on Tuesday when the greatest patriotic demonstration since the Civil War brought out a procession of fully 5,000 men, marching with banners through cheering crowds.

In Belfast, Maine, on Tuesday, twenty or so grizzled veterans of the Civil War shouldered their old Springfield rifles and marched to the Coliseum theatre where they were one of the big features of a patriotic mass meeting.

GERMAN PAPERS ATTACK WILSON Berlin, April 6.—(Via London)—Hitler personally attacks on President Wilson and the reputation of the distinction he drew between the German people and their government feature the comments of German newspapers on the president's message to congress.

THE LOCAL ANZIGER says: "America must know that the war is directed not against the German people but the German government cannot detract from the anger which his attitude during the whole war has fostered and which his last message has fanned into a bright flame. For this assurance is untrue and dishonest as all the rest of the document from the first word to the last.
