### NATIONAL DRIVE TO SAVE EYES

Conservation Council Extends Its Activities to Schools in Every State of Union.

New York, May 6.—The success of the plan of co-operative effort between the public schools of New York City and the Eyesight Conservation Council of America on Health Day, when more than 1,000,000 pupils underwent physical examination, has led the council to extend its activities to the schools of the nation. School officials in every state are being enlisted in a nationwide campaign for better eyesight. Commissioner John J. Tigert of the United States Department of Education, a member of the council, is fostering federal activity for improved vision.

"Eye conservation is being carried into schools and industries of New York and other states, as a part of the national movement by the Eyesight Conservation Council of America, to protect the health of America's millions of school children and industrial workers," Gov. A. Henry, general director of the council, said yesterday.

"This movement is largely the outcome of revelation of huge waste through defective vision, made by Herbert Hoover's committee on Elimination of Waste in Industry of the American Engineering Council. The findings of this engineering committee, which are having a great influence upon industry both here and abroad, will be utilized by those who are working of the conservation of vision. The United States Department of Education, schools, industries, the professions and the colleges, including Teachers' College, Columbia University's Training School for Teachers, will co-operate.

"The Engineering Waste Committee found that about 25,000,000 American workers have defective vision requiring correction, and that many thousand eye accidents can be prevented each year by the application of proved remedial methods. A chief aim of the campaign is to save as many lives next year as possible, and, according to L. W. Wallace, executive secretary of the American Engineering Council, 'increase the quality and quantity of production in American industry and contribute to a larger sum total of happiness.'"

The aid of State Superintendent Frank P. Graves, City Superintendent William L. Ettinger and other school officials is being sought. Annual co-operation on

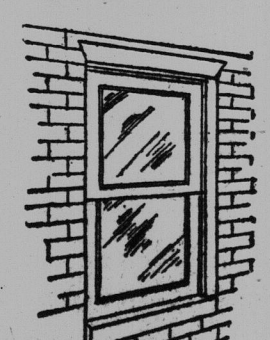

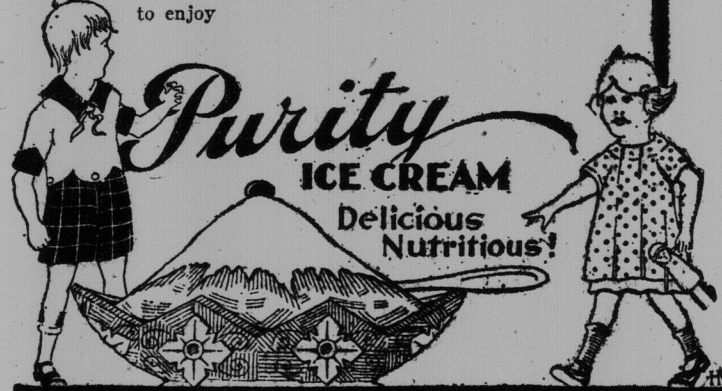

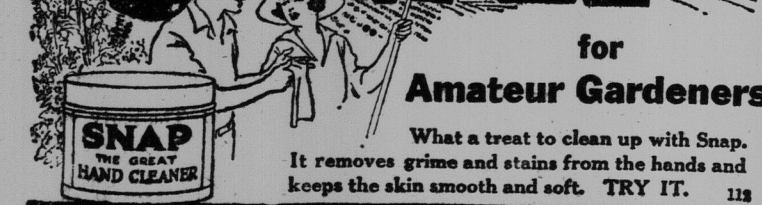
